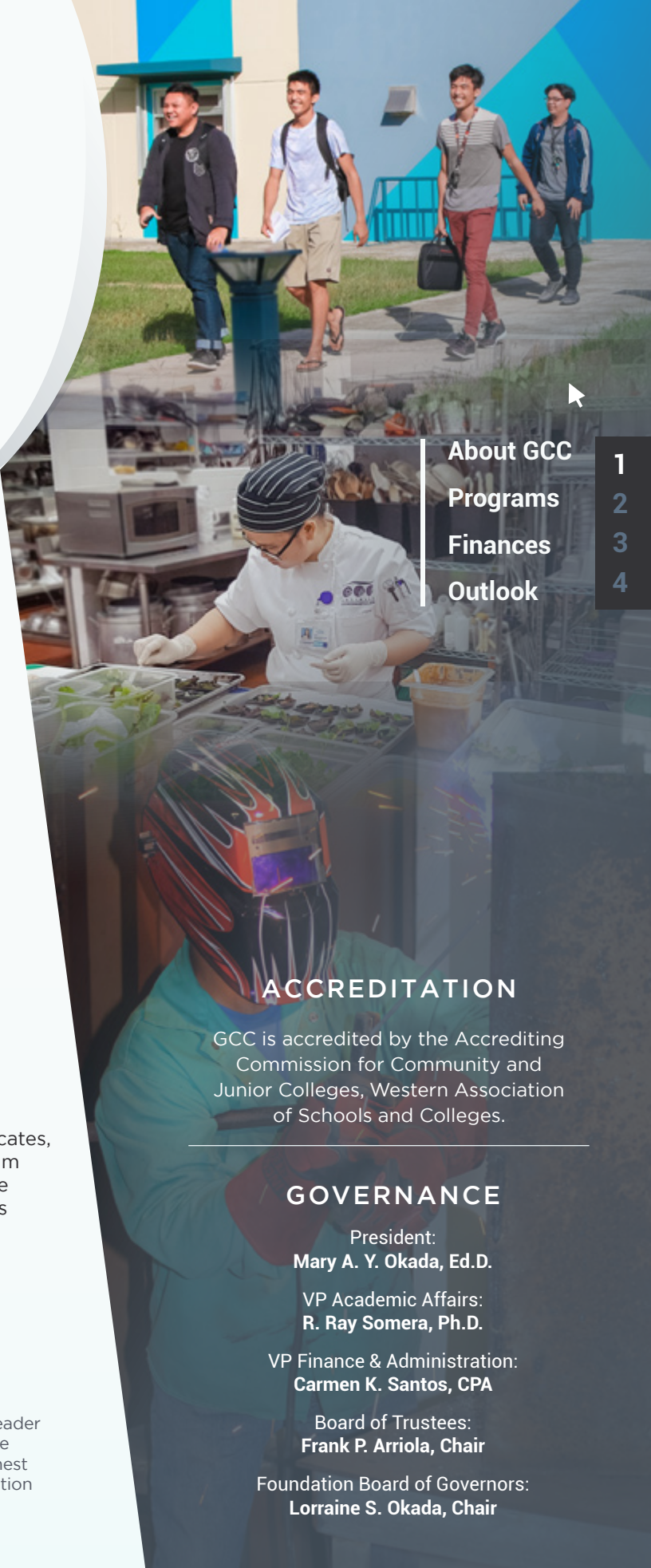

SUCCESSES

The World Association of Chef Societies Education Review Panel: GCC's Culinary Arts program meets and in some cases, exceeds WACS Standards of Quality Culinary Education.

30 people completed the 15th Criminal Justice Academy at GCC on Aug. 11

18 law enforcement officials from Guam, Pohnpei, Kosrae, Chuuk, Palau, and Yap completed the first-ever Marine Terrestrial Conservation Enforcement Academy July 24 - Oct. 6.

67 high school students took advantage of GCC's CLYMER (Classroom Learning Yields Math & English Readiness) program, which allows those with good grades to skip the placement test and enroll directly into college-level math and English courses at GCC.

SECONDARY CAREER & TECHNICAL EDUCATION (CTE) PROGRAMS

Dual Credit Articulated Programs of Study (DCAPS) in GCC's 11 CTE programs in our public high schools allows students to graduate with college credit, providing a direct pathway to GCC for nearly 3,000 students.

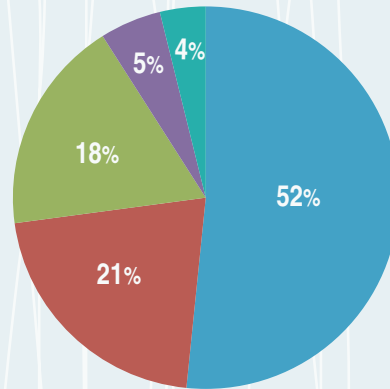

Revenues FY 2017

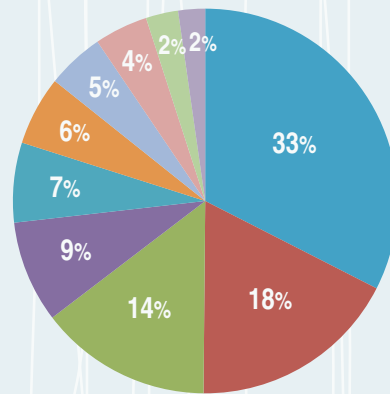

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INNOVATION

CTE Telecommunications

A NEW Secondary CTE program – Telecommunications – launches at Tiyan High School in August 2018, with anticipated enrollment of 100 students. Participating students can earn up to 19 credits toward an Associate of Science Computer Science at GCC upon graduation from high school through GCC’s Dual Credit Articulated Programs of Study (DCAPS).

Early Middle College

GCC will launch its Early Middle College proposal in October 2018. This concept aligns postsecondary courses with high school courses to allow students to earn a certificate or associate degree from GCC upon graduation from high school.

HIGHLIGHTS

The Okkodo High School CTE ProStart team took 2nd place at the National ProStart Invitational in Charleston, South Carolina, on April 30, keeping Guam’s name at the top of the prestigious high school national competition.

Federal Emergency Management Agency used GCC’s LEED gold Building E to showcase mitigation best practices with FEMA Hazard Mitigation Assistance funding (Jan. 2017)

GCC Student Veterans Club hosts first mini-forum, “No Veteran Left Behind,” and Veterans Club accepted into Student Veterans of America (SVA), a national coalition of nearly 1,400 student veteran organizations across the U.S.

PROGRESS

Reduced percentage of students testing into developmental math from 95% in 2016 to 57% in 2016; increased percentage of students testing into college level math from 5% in 2016 to 43% in 2017, through CLYMER program and use of ACCLUPLACER test for incoming freshman.

Continued collaboration with DOA to meet financial obligations and maintain clean audit status.

CLYMER students passed math and English courses at a 95% (math) and 94% (English) rate.

CHALLENGES

Release of timely allotments from the government of Guam

Students entering college with remedial math and English skills

SUSTAINABILITY

GCC PV systems generated 190.107 Megawatts of clean energy, saving \$51,328.89 in power costs.

Refillable water stations in Student Lounge & Building E eliminated the use of 8,940 12 oz. plastic water bottles on campus.

CAMPUS FACILITIES

Renovation/expansion of former Butler Building 100, which adjoins the LEED-gold Building E, scheduled for completion in fall 2018.

Ground broken for renovation of Building 300, which will become new and larger Multipurpose Auditorium, on April 25.
