152 complete Keep Your Guard Up

"Don't stop now." That was GCC President Okada's message to 152 Guam veterans during a ceremony marking the completion of the Keep Your Guard Up program at the National Guard Readiness Center on July 8. KYGU was implemented after Adjutant General Maj. Gen. Benny Paulino informed Guam's leaders last year that 260 of the 588 men and women of the I-294th Infantry Regiment deployed to Afghanistan would be returning home in January 2014 either unemployed or under-employed.

While the soldiers were still in country, GCC surveyed them and formulated a 90-day industry certification program in eight areas. The 152 soldiers earned enrichment certificates for having gained employable



skills. Some also earned completion certificates, National Career Readiness Certificates and valuable industry certifications. Okada encouraged them to continue with their studies at GCC. "Some of you are only a few credits away from your degree or certificate," she said. Employers DCK Pacific, Cabras Marine, Cars Plus, the Guam Fire Department, and even GCC have hired several dozen of the KYGU veterans, and others have already signed up to take courses at GCC for fall semester.

On June 3, nearly 100 students at John F. Kennedy High School that have earned their National Career Readiness Certificates gathered in the school gym to commemorate their success. Several dozen of the students are graduating seniors.

GCC now a member of SOC

Talofofo CAP is fourth to open!

GCC opened its fourth Community Access Point (CAP) at the Talofofo Mayor's Office on June 4. The first cohort of 10 residents will take free online training via the KeyTrain component of WorkKeys, the Job Assessment and Training program offered by GCC. When they complete KeyTrain, they can take the \$65 test to earn a National Career Readiness Certificate - proof for employers of specific skills that they have mastered. In exchange, the residents work two hours a week on village beautification projects. GCC also has CAPS in Inarajan, Sinajana, and Tamuning, through a partnership with the Guam Contractor's Association, the Guam Chamber of Commerce, the Mayor's Council of Guam, and PC Merge. CACGP Renewable Energy Program

The CACGP Renewable Energy Summer Program culminated on June 27 with the eight high school participants connecting their solar panel projects outside the Technology Center to power up light bulbs! Three of the four two-person teams' projects turned on without a hitch, and one team had to make a small adjustment, but overall: success! Instructor Terry Kuper from GCC's Technology Department said the two-week course was designed to teach the students about emerging careers related to power conservation, sustainability and keeping the environment eco-friendly.
