
# FROM THE ALO'S DESK.

DR. RAY SOMERA, AVP VICE PRESIDENT FOR ACADEMIC AFFAIRS

From Nov. 18-21, I conducted Health Resources & Services Administration (HRSA) Grant and TracDat Training at the College of the Marshall Islands (CMI). This trip's purpose was two-fold: First, to lay the groundwork for a collaborative partnership between the Marshall Islands' Single State Agency (SSA) and the College of Marshall Islands (CMI) so that these two entities can successfully participate in the HRSA grant funding opportunity; and second, to provide assessment and TracDat training workshop for key CMI faculty, staff, and administrators who are responsible for institutional accreditation. As the college is in the initial implementation of TracDat, which began in spring 2015, this training is intended as an integral part of their preparations for their March 2016 progress report to ACCJC.

To cap off my trip, I was invited to dinner by CMI president Dr. Theresa Koroivulaono, where we had a good discussion on accreditation-related matters, as well as on the assessment infrastructure that would provide support to TracDat implementation. Earlier in the afternoon, I also made a courtesy visit to the Minister of Education, Dr. Hilda Heini, where we discussed possible collaborative partnerships between K-12 (PSS) and CMI, particularly on the areas of program quality and assessment.

Sowing the seeds of collaboration and partnership across the western Pacific is in keeping with our mission as "a leader in career & technical workforce development, providing the highest quality, student-centered education and job training for Micronesia." Biba GCC!

The GCC Ecowarriors in December helped stop a proposal to building a stormwater culvert that experts say would have channeled untreated stormwater into Tumon Bay. They made a difference by petitioning, participating in a Facebook campaign, through word of mouth, and by making signs and marching with about 250 people around Adelup on Dec. 11, and attending a GEDCA round table on Dec. 17th. The campaign effectively tossed the proposal into the waste bin. "That this campaign was successful is evidence that your opinions and actions do matter and can make a difference," according to Joni Kerr, GCC science professor and Ecowarriors advisor.

The Ecowarriors also held a R.E.E.F. Celebration on Nov. 7 in the GCC Student Center Training Room to celebrate the success of the Guam Community Coral Reef Monitoring Program (GCCRMP). This is a NOAA project that Ecowarriors and various Marine Biology service learners have been volunteering with for over two years!


