ASSOCIATE OF SCIENCE IN PRACTICAL NURSING

The Associate of Science in Practical Nursing 2024-2025 cohort, which graduated on May 8, 2025, currently has a 67% first-write pass rate, with 18 out of 27 students having taken the NCLEX-PN exam. The remaining students are preparing to take their licensing exam and are anticipated to do so before the end of the year.

The 2025-2026 ASPN cohort completed their first semester in November 2025, with 18 students continuing to the 2026 spring semester. The students successfully completed 60 hours of lecture for NU-160 Pharmacology for Practical Nurses, as well as 60 hours of lecture, 35 hours of lab, and 145 hours of clinical for NU110 Nursing Foundations & Basic Skills.

On November 09, 2025, the ASPN cohort participated in the Teddy Bear Clinic at the Micronesia Mall. The event engages children in age-appropriate activities to help them understand medical processes and reduce fears and anxieties associated with seeing a doctor. The students donated leftover teddy bears to the Guam Memorial Hospital Pediatric Ward and visited patients there.

During the holiday season, the students held a Gift-Wrapping fundraiser at the Micronesia Mall. Proceeds from the event were donated to the Make-A-Wish Foundation.

The Nursing and Allied Health Department continues to seek qualified adjunct faculty to instruct the laboratory and clinical components of NU-level courses required for the program.

Students who are interested in the Associate of Science in Practical Nursing are highly encouraged to seek guidance from the Nursing & Allied Health Department. The next application period for the 2026-2027 ASPN cohort will be during the 2026 fall semester, with the next cohort anticipated to start in the 2027 spring semester.
