MINUTES

The meeting of November 28, 2007 was called to order at 3:15 p.m., by Chairperson Mr. John K. Lee. The meeting was held in the GCC President's Conference Room located at the Student Services & Administration Building.

II. APPROVAL OF MINUTES

1. Quarterly Meeting of July 11, 2007

- 1V. REPORTS
 - President's Report

Campus Improvement Projects: President Okada reported that price quotations are currently being obtained for several campus improvement projects that were approved by the Board of Trustees, such as non-ski upgrades to several pathways on campus, environmental related issues, asbetos issues, etc. The amount of \$334,000 has already been set aside to address the CIP's. Project priority is based on the need and on costs. Each project is reviewed by the Budget Resource Committee, the Faculty Senate, and the Governing Council, then is presented to the Board of Trustees for approval. The President further noted that a campus wide environmental study has not yet been done, however as buildings are scheduled to be refurbished, that segment will be incorporated as part of the assessment.

<u>Budget Updates:</u> President Okada noted that in FY2006, though GCC did not receive its appropriation of \$2.8 million, 2006 encumbrances were carried over to FY2007. Then in FY2007, GCC was under budgeted primarily because GCC did not receive the \$900,000 lapsed budget nor did GCC spend that amount. The good news however is that this coming Friday GCC is expected to receive \$1 million for FY07. For FY2008, GCC has not yet received any of its appropriation from the General Fund because the books for FY08 are just now being loaded by the DOA and BBMR.

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Grant Writing for Diesal Mechanics program: President Okada shared that in relation to the Trades Academy with the Guam Contractors Association, she had the opportunity to meet with faculty members of the Diesel Mechanics program at the University of Hawaii in Hilo. GCC is currently writing a grant to support this program. Additionally, President Okada noted that focusing on what GCC has to offer, she's made presentations to SHRM, to the Western Micronesian Executives in Saipan, to USDOL in Washington, DC, and to USDOI.

Quarterly Investment Reports, as of September 30, 2007

Upon his review of the investment reports provided, Mr. Cruz noted that the Foundation's funds are well invested with good returns. However, he strongly recommended that the Foundation Board create, if one does not currently exist, an Investment Policy Statement. Lou Bautista to provide Mr. Cruz a copy of the Investment Policy statement currently on file.

In light of various campus improvement projects and requests made by GCC to the Foundation to support some of the funding, Chair Lee asked Mr. Cruz to review the Quasi-Endowment Fund and develop a cash flow report for 12-months.

UNFINISHED BUSINESS

New Science & Allied Health Building (update)

President Okada reiterated that initially she had proposed to the Foundation Board to enter into a Municipal Lease to fund the Science & Allied Health Building. However, after meeting with Governor Camacho and after her return from a recent trip to Washington DC, Governor Camacho has included under the budget of DOI a 100% funding request for GCC's Science & Allied Health Building. Therefore, her request to the Foundation Board for funding assistance will now be for another project which will be discussed under New Business.

VI. NEW BUSINESS

- 1. Welcome & Introduction of New Foundation Board Members:
 - Mr. Eduardo R. Ilao, GCC Board of Trustees
 - Mr. James Martinez, Guam Contractors Association

Foundation members welcomed both Mr. Ilao and Mr. Martinez to the Board. Mr. Ilao is a member of the GCC Board of Trustees and is also the Chairman of the American Red Cross. His term as a board member for the Red Cross expires on June 30, 2008.

Mr. Martinez is the Executive Director for the Guam Contractors Association and continues to be involved with GCC through its Apprenticeship program. He briefly spoke about the newly developed Trades Academy under GCA, the potential leasing of property at Tiyan under GIAA, the revision of the Construction Trades program standards to meet national standards, and on getting GCC to be accredited as the training facility under the NCCR.
