Applicant Frequently Asked Questions

Are these permanent positions?

2020 Census of Guam positions are temporary. Each position will extend through summer of 2020.

Which positions are full-time or part-time?

Field Operations Supervisor and Office Clerk are full-time positions. Crew Leaders can either be full or part-time, depending upon the applicant. Crew Leader Assistants and Enumerators are part-time positions.

I already have a full-time job. Can I still apply for a part-time position?

Yes! 2020 Census of Guam positions have flexible work hours that allow for employees to perform their work duties even if they have a full-time job elsewhere.

I am a current GovGuam employee. Can I still apply? And if so, do I need to submit police/court clearances and drug testing?

Current GovGuam employees can apply for 2020 Census of Guam positions, however some conditions do apply. They will not need to submit police/court clearances or undergo drug testing.

I am a retired GovGuam employee. Will I lose my retirement benefits working for the 2020 Census of Guam?

No. Working for the 2020 Census of Guam will have no impact on retiree benefits.

I am not a U.S. citizen, can I still apply for a 2020 Census of Guam position?

Yes. Applicants can either be a U.S. citizen or a resident with a legal right to work on Guam.

I don't have my own car. Can I still be an Enumerator and have someone else drive me while I perform data collection?

While having a car is not a requirement, it is preferred. In the event an Enumerator does not have a car, they can have someone drive them. However, the Enumerator must then carry their materials with them at all times to protect the confidentiality of the information.

Do these positions require I work evenings, weekends, and/or holidays?

2020 Census of Guam positions may require working evenings, weekends and/or holidays. This work will continue at the same rate of pay, unless the employee has worked over 40 hours for the week.

Are Enumerators paired with other Enumerators during data collection?

Enumerators will typically conduct their data collection individually. However, they will be periodically observed by their Crew Leader or Field Operations Supervisor.
