SOCIETY of MANAGEMENT INDUSTRY LEADERS for EXCELLENCE (SMILE)

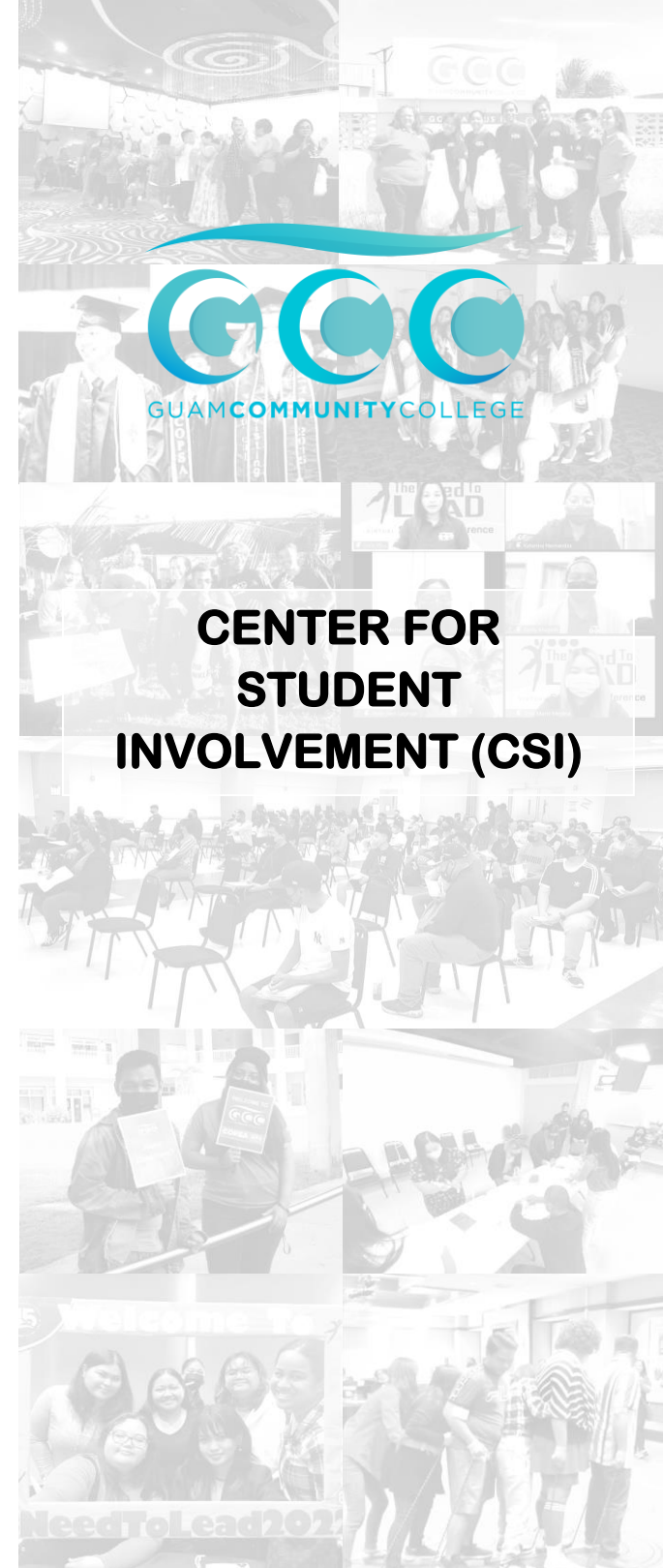
PURPOSE: To support all students seeking a business degree, teach members how to be socially aware, and provide service to the community.
