ELIGIBILITY

GCC is mandated through Public Law 14-77 to provide adult education to individuals who are 16 years of age and not enrolled or required to be enrolled in a secondary school under Guam Law (Public Law 34-104; Compulsory Age 18yrs. Old), and is—

- Basic skills deficient
- Does not have a secondary school diploma or its recognized equivalent, and has not achieved an equivalent level of education; or
- An English language learner who has limited ability in reading, writing, speaking, or comprehending the English language and whose native language is a language other than English or lives in a family or community environment where a language other than English is the dominant language.

REGISTRATION REQUIREMENT

- Valid Government Issued ID
(Guam ID, Driver's License, Passport)
- Social Security Card
- Letter of withdrawal from last school attended (if 18 yrs. old)

ADULT EDUCATION PROGRAMS

Basic Literacy

The basic literacy courses are designed to assist students who score below a 239 in reading and below a 236 in math develop and improve their skills needed for employment and in preparation to go through the Adult High School Diploma Program or take the GED® or HiSET® exams.

Adult High School Diploma (AHSD)

The AHSD offers eligible individuals the opportunity to earn credits toward their diploma while receiving education and training, in preparation for the workplace and/or postsecondary education.

English Language Acquisition English-As-A-Second Language (ESL)

ESL courses are designed to assist English Language Learners (ELL) develop and improve their reading, writing, and speaking and listening skills. English language acquisition programs must also help ELLs obtain a high school diploma or its recognized equivalent and support them as they move toward further education, training, or employment.
